Where would you like to travel?


Italy, Greece, France, Spain, England, Germany, Norway. Okay, all of Europe!

Taking Responsibility

It is important for middle school students to take responsibility for their actions and keep up with their commitments.

Admit Mistakes

It is very typical for kids this age to immediately deny doing something wrong. They do this because they do not want to get into trouble and to protect their pride. Middle school students will be more willing to admit mistakes if you don't overreact when they do confess. Instead, use a neutral tone, and give a gentle reminder for minor offenses.

Avoid Excuses

Does your child have an excuse for everything? Make it clear it is their responsibility to find a way to get things done.

Accept Blame

If your child is in the hot seat, they may be attempted to blame others. Explain that blaming others does not solve problems.


