ADMINISTERING MEDICATION TO STUDENTS

Any school employee authorized in writing by the school administrator or school principal:

- May administer any drug which may lawfully be sold over the counter, without a prescription, to a pupil in compliance with the written instructions of the pupil's parent or guardian, if the pupil's parent or guardian consents in writing.
- 2. May administer a prescription drug to a pupil in compliance with the written instructions of a practitioner, if the pupil's parent or guardian consents in writing.
- Is immune from civil liability for his/her acts or omissions in administering a non-prescription drug or prescription drug to a pupil under subd. 1 or 2, unless the act or omission constitutes a high degree of negligence. This subdivision does not apply to health care professionals.

An asthmatic student may possess and use a metered dose inhaler or dry powder inhaler while in school, at a school-sponsored activity or under the supervision of a school authority. A student may possess and use such an inhaler only if all of the following are true:

- 1. The student uses the inhaler before exercise to prevent the onset of asthmatic symptoms or uses the inhaler to alleviate asthmatic symptoms.
- 2. The student has the written approval of the student's physician and if the student is a minor, the written approval of the student's parent/guardian.
- 3. The student has provided the principal with a copy of the required approval or approvals.

Policy 453.4 Continued:

School bus drivers, school employees or volunteers authorized by state statutes to use an epinephrine auto-injector (Epi pen) to administer epinephrine to any student who appears to be experiencing a severe allergic reaction without liability if, as soon as practicable, he/she reports the allergic reaction by dialing 911 for emergency medical service.

Diagnosis and treatment of illness and the prescribing of drugs are never responsibilities of a school and should not be practiced by any school personnel.
