POLICY 461-Rule

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP TIE BREAKING PROCEDURES

If a tie exists with the grade point average, the following criteria will e used in succession to break the tie and prioritize the remaining students as alternates;

- A. The student who has applied and been accepted in a participating university, technical college or private college in Wisconsin will be the recipient. Proof of acceptance must be received by the high school guidance office by February 1.
- B. The student who has the highest grade point average using 4.33 for A+'s.
- C. The student who has the highest composite ACT score will be named the recipient. Proof of score must be received by the high school guidance office by February 1.
- D. The student who has completed the greatest number of semesters in Advanced Placement courses will be the recipient.
- E. The student with the greatest number of credits after seven semesters will be named the recipient.
- F. A coin flip will determine the recipient. This would be done in the presence of each student and/or their adult representative with at least one administrator and at least one scholarship committee member present.
