

## MINERAL POINT UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT POLICY 751-Rule

## TRANSPORTATION IN AREAS OF UNUSUAL HAZARD

The Mineral Point Unified School District has a policy of transporting students who reside not less than 1.5 miles away from the school they attend. Within the 1.5 mile limit, the school Board has identified two areas which it considers to be unusually hazardous.

## Criteria

The criteria examined in determining areas of unusual hazard as follows:

- 1. Traffic volume
- 2. Speed of traffic
- 3. Existence of shoulder, width of shoulder, paved or gravel shoulder
- 4. Existence of sidewalks
- 5. Nature of traffic using the street(s)
- 6. Presence or absence of crossing guards
- 7. Presence or absence of traffic controls
- 8. Age of children in the area
- 9. Temporary hazards (i.e. construction sites)
- 10. Existence of street lighting
- 11. Proximity of law enforcement (i.e. is the street within or outside of the city limits)
- 12. Topography (i.e. blind curves)
