

Our goal with summer school is to provide additional educational experiences for students that review and extend the knowledge, skills, and dispositions we deem as a priority. Related, we want students to enjoy learning more as a result of these experiences.

Two items to note:

- Due to construction at the elementary building, all courses will be housed at the middle school/high school.
- Bussing will be provided for students July 6-22. Breakfast and a take home lunch will also be offered to all students when in session on these days.

Summer School Course Offerings

Elementary (K-5)

The elementary school is running one session of summer school for the following dates and times:

- July 6-9 Tuesday-Friday
- July 12-22 Monday-Thursday
- 8 A.M. to 11 A.M.

Development of literacy and mathematical skills will be embedded in all K-5 courses.

Rhyme Time (Incoming Kindergarten)

Learn and practice rhymes from a variety of texts, including picture books, poetry and Mother Goose. Students will engage in creative writing as a class. In addition, students will have social/play opportunities with peers at school.

Become a Super Reader (Incoming 1st grade)

Learn about the powers that help students become super readers. Strategies and skills will be modeled and time will be provided for students to apply these powers in books of interest and choice. There will be a special focus on making books for an authentic audience.

Games, Games, Games (Incoming 2nd grade)

Students will explore games (gamification) in several core subject areas. A mix of many play opportunities that encourage health and wellness will be provided, along with opportunities for structured collaboration and self-directed projects.

Learning Globally through Local Studies (Incoming 3rd grade)

Daily adventures will be provided for students, exploring local businesses, organizations and sites to learn more about our city and region. Concepts from these experiences will support student development of a broader perspective of our world.

Healthy Habits (Incoming 4th grade)

Students will learn about the process for building habits that promote healthy behaviors, both physical and mental. Articles and other content around personal growth will be introduced to build knowledge around lifelong skill development.

Music to Our Ears (Incoming 5th grade)

Students will explore sound and language as they investigate and inquire into their world. There will be opportunities to set up experiments and apply the scientific method to areas of interests within these concepts.

#PointerNationReads- Incoming 6-8 (June 7 through August 12, 10-11 A.M., Monday – Thursday)

Middle school students can join a community of readers online for conversation and connection around favorite texts. Students will be grouped accordingly by enrollment. This community will be hosted via Zoom.

Introduction to American Sign Language (Incoming 1st-6th, August 2-6, 8-11 A.M.)

Students will learn basic grammar, vocabulary, fingerspelling, numbers, and cultural information related to the Deaf Community. Students will also participate in interactive activities throughout the class time to maximize their learning of American Sign Language. Class size is limited to 24.

Middle Level (6-8)

The middle school will offer various courses and camps throughout the summer for incoming 6th, 7th, and 8th graders. Transportation will be available from July 6-22.

Credit Recovery

Students will receive support from middle school teachers to recover credit from the 2020-2021 school year. There are two 3-week sessions; students who need to attend specific sessions will be notified. For those recovering, Reading 7 or 8, new reading instruction will also be provided from 8-11 A.M.
